Important Changes

Following the recent national review of the CNZ Creative Communities Scheme, there will be changes to the way the Scheme is administered in 2010. The monthly funding rounds will cease after the round closing 15 February 2010 and distribution of the CCS funding will then be available by applying to the 3 funding rounds:-

Closing dates – 31st March 2010, 30th June 2010, 31st October 2010.

Eligibility criteria and other information remain the same.

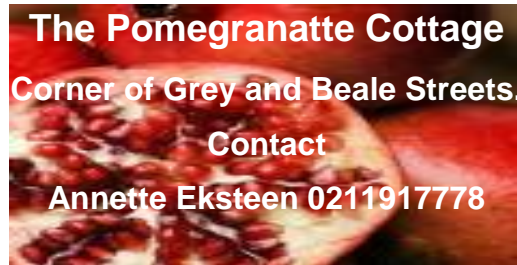
